

TO THE DEALER:

Assembly and proper installation of this product is the responsibility of the Alloway dealer. Read manual instructions and safety rules. Make sure all items on the Dealer's Pre-Delivery and Delivery Check Lists in the Operator's Manual are completed before releasing equipment to the owner.

The dealer must complete the Warranty Registration included in this manual. Both dealer and customer must sign the registration which certifies that all Dealer Check List items have been completed. The dealer is to return the prepaid postage portion to Alloway, give one copy to the customer, and retain one copy.

Note: Warranty credit is subject to this form being completed and returned.

TO THE OWNER:

Read this manual before operating your Alloway equipment. The information presented will prepare you to do a better and safer job. Keep this manual handy for ready reference. Require all operators to read this manual carefully and become acquainted with all the adjustment and operating procedures before attempting to operate. Replacement manuals can be obtained from your dealer.

The equipment you have purchased has been carefully engineered and manufactured to provide dependable and satisfactory use. Like all mechanical products, it will require cleaning and upkeep. Lubricate the unit as specified. Observe all safety information in this manual and safety decals on the equipment.

For service, your authorized Alloway dealer has trained mechanics, genuine Alloway service parts, and the necessary tools and equipment to handle all your needs.

Use only genuine Alloway service parts. Substitute parts will void the warranty and may not meet standards required for safe and satisfactory operation. Record the model number and serial number of your equipment in the spaces provided:

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GENERAL INFORMATION

The purpose of this manual is to assist you in operating and maintaining your Alloway Seedbetter. Read it carefully. It furnishes information and instructions that will help you achieve years of dependable performance. These instructions have been compiled from extensive field experience and engineering data. Some information may be general in nature due to unknown and varying operating conditions. However, through experience and these instructions, you should be able to develop procedures suitable to your particular situation.

The illustrations and data used in this manual were current at the time of printing, but due to possible inline production changes, your machine may vary slightly in detail. We reserve the right to redesign and change the machines as may be necessary without notification.

Throughout this manual, references are made to right and left direction. These are determined by standing behind the equipment facing the direction of forward travel.

Safety is a primary concern in the design and manufacture of our products. Unfortunately, our efforts to provide safe equipment can be wiped out by a single careless act of an operator.

In addition to the design and configuration of equipment, hazard control and accident prevention are dependent upon the awareness, concern, prudence and proper training of personnel involved in the operation, transport, maintenance and storage of equipment.

It has been said "The best safety device is an informed, careful operator." We ask you to be that kind of an operator.

The designed and tested safety of this equipment depends on it being operated within the limitations as explained in this manual.

TRAINING

- Safety instructions are important! Read all attachment and power unit manuals; follow all safety rules and safety decal information. (Replacement manuals are available from dealer). Failure to follow instructions or safety rules can result in serious injury or death.
- If you do not understand any part of this manual and need assistance, see your dealer.
- Know your controls and how to stop engine and attachment quickly in an emergency.
- Operators must be instructed in and be capable of the safe operation of the equipment, its attachments and all controls. Do not allow anyone to operate this equipment without proper instructions.
- Keep hands and body away from pressurized lines. Use paper or cardboard, not body parts to check for leaks. Wear safety goggles. Hydraulic fluid under pressure can easily penetrate skin and will cause serious injury or death.
- Make sure that all operating and service personnel know that in the event hydraulic fluid penetrates skin, it must be surgically removed as soon as possible by a doctor familiar with this form of injury, or gangrene, seirous injury or death will result. CONTACT A PHYSICIAN IMMEDIATELY IF FLUID ENTERS SKIN OR EYES. DO NOT DELAY

Never allow children or untrained persons to operate equipment.

PREPARATION

- Check that all hardware is tight and properly installed. Always tighten to torque chart specifications unless instructed otherwise in this manual.
- Air in hydraulic systems can cause erratic operation and allow loads or equipment components to drop unexpectedly. Before operating or allowing anyone to approach the equipment, purge any air in the system by operating all hydraulic functions several times after connecting equipment, connecting hoses, or doing any hydraulic maintenance.
- Make sure all hydraulic hoses, fittings and valves are in good condition and not leaking before starting power unit or using equipment. Check and route hoses carefully to prevent damage. Hoses must not be twisted, bent sharply, kinked, frayed, pinched, or come into contact with any moving parts. Operate moveable components through full operational range to check clearances. Replace any damaged hoses immediately.
- Always wear relatively tight and belted clothing to avoid entanglement in moving parts. Wear sturdy, rough-soled work shoes and protective equipment for eyes, hair, hands, hearing, and head; and respirator or filter mask where appropriate.
- Ensure implement is properly attached, adjusted and in good operating condition.
- Power unit must be equipped with ROPS or ROPS CAB and seat belt. Keep seat belt securely fastened. Falling off power unit can result in death from being run over or crushed. Keep foldable ROPS systems in "locked up" postion at all times.
- Removed accumulated debris from this equipment, tractor and engine to avoid fire hazard.

- A minimum 20% of tractor and equipment weight must be on tractor front wheels when attachments are in trasport position. Without this weight, tractor could tip over, causing personal injury or death. The weight may be attained with a loader, front whee weights, ballast in tires or front tractor weights. When attaining the minimum 20% weight on the front wheels, you must not exceed the Roll Over Protection Structure (ROPS) weight certification. Weigh the tractor and equipment. Do not estimate.
- Make sure hydraulic hoses and cylinders are fully purged of air before operating. Keep all person away and fill the system by raising and lowering all functions serveral times. Air in the system can allow compenents to fall unexpectedly.

TRANSPORTING

- Power unit must be equiped with ROPS or ROPS CAB and seat belt. Keep seat belt securely fastened. Falling off power unit can result in death from being run over or crushed. Keep folable ROPS systems in "locked up" position at all times
- Always sit in power unit seat when perating controls or starting engine. Securely fasten seatbelt, place transmission in neutral, engage brake, and ensure all other controls are disengaged before starting power unit engine.
- A minimum 20% of tractor and quipment weight must be on the tractor front wheels when attachments are in transport position. Without this weight, tractorcould tip over, causing personal injury or death. The weight may be attained with a loader, front wheel weights, ballast in tires, or front tractor weights. Weight the tractor and equipment, Do not estimate.
- Always attach safety chain to tractor drawbar when transporting unit.

- Never exceed 20 MPH during transport. See the Speed vs. Weight Ratio Table in "Field Operation, Transporting the Unit" for proper tow vehicle to machine weight ratios.
- Watch for hidden hazards on the terrain.
- Always comply with all state and local lighting and marking requirements.
- Never allow riders on power unit or attachment.
- Look down and to the rear to make sure area is clear before operating in reverse.
- Do not operate or transport on steep slopes.
- Use extreme care and reduced group speed on slopes and rough terrain.
- Do not operate or transport equipment while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

OPERATION

- Do not allow bystanders in the area when operating, attaching, removing, assembling, or servicing equipment.
- Do not allow anyone to stand between tractor and unit when backing up to unit.
- Never go underneath equipment (lowered to the ground or raised) unless it is properly blocked and secured. Never place any part of the body underneath equipment or between movable parts even when the engine has been turned off. Hydraulic system leak down, hydraulic system failures, mechanice failures, or movement of control levers can cause equipment to drops or rotate unexpectedly and cause severe injury or death. Follow Operator's Manual instructions for working underneath and blocking requirements or have work done by a qualified dealer.

- Keep bystanders away from equipment
- Do not operate or transport equipment while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Operate only in daylight or good artificial light.
- Avoid contact with electrical wires.
- Always comply with all state and local lighting and marking requirements.
- Power unit must be equipped with ROPS or ROPS CAB and seat belt. Keep seat belt securely fastened. Falling off power unit can result in death from being run over or crushed. Keep foldable ROPS systems in "locked up" position at all times.
- Always set in power unit seat when operating controls or starting engine. Securely fasten seat belt, place transmission in neutral, engage brake, and ensure all other controls are disengaged before starting power unit engine.
- Look down and to the rear and make sure area is clear before operating in reverse. Do not operate or tranport on steep slopes.
- Do not stop, start, or change directions suddenly on slopes.
- Use extreme care and reduced groud speed on slopes and rought terrain.
- Watch for hidden hazards on the terrain during operation.
- Always coonect safety chain from equipment to towoing vehicle when transporting.
- AVOID INJURY OR DEATH FROM POWER LINES:
 - Stay away from power lines
 - Electrocution can occure without direct contact.
 - Check clearances before raising implement
 - ♦ Do not leave the operator's seat if any

part of the tractor or implement contacts electric lines.

- Before servicing, adjusting, repairing or unplugging, stop tractor engine, place all controls in neurtral, set park brake, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- Before working underneath a raised implement, read and follow all Operator's Manual instructions and safety rules. Implement must be attached to tractor. Hydraulic system lead down, hydraulic system failures, or movement of controls levers can cause equipment to drop unexpectedly and cause severe injry or death.

MAINTENANCE

- Before servicing, adjusting, repairing, or unplugging, stop tractor engine, place all controls in neutral, set park brake, remove ignition key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- Before working underneath a raised implement, read and follow all Operator's Manual instructions and safety rules. Implement must be attached to tractor. Hydraulic system leak down, hydraulic system failures, or movement of control levers can cause equipment to drop unexpectedly anc cause severe injury or death.
- Service and maintenance work not covered in OWNER SERVICE must be done by a qualified dealership. Special skills, tools, and safety procesdures may be required. Failure to follow these instructions can result in serious injry or death.
- Do not modify or alter or permit anyone else to modify or alter the equipment or any of its components in any way.
- Your dealer can supply original equipment hydraulic accessories and repair parts. Subsitute parts may not meet original equipment specifications and may be dangerous.

Follow Operator's Manual instructions for working underneath and blocking requirements, or have work done by a qualified dealer.
- Ensure implement is properly attached, adjusted and in good operating condition.
- Make sure hydraulic hoses and cylinders are fully purged of air before operating. Keep all persons away and fill the system by raising and lowering all functions several times. Air in the system can allow components to fall unexpectedly.
- Keep all person away from operator control area while performing adjustments, service, or maintenance.
- Ensure all safety decals are installed. Replaced if damaged. (See Safety Decals section for location)
- Do not disconnect hydraulic lines until machine is securely blocked or placed in lowest position and system pressure is released by operating all valve control levers.


STORAGE



CHECK LISTS

PRE-DELIVERY CHECK LIST

(DEALER'S RESPONSIBILITY)

Inspect the equipment thoroughly after assembly to ensure it is set up properly before delivering it to the customer.

The following check lists are a reminder of points to inspect. Check off each item as it is found satisfactory or after proper adjustment is made.

Check that all safety decals are installed and in good condition. Replace if damaged.
Properly attach implement to tractor and make all necessary adjustments.
Check all bolts to be sure they are tight.
Check wheel bolts for proper torque.
Check that all cotter pins and safety pins are properly installed. Replace if damaged.
Check and grease all lubrication points as identified in "Service, lubrication information."
Check the level of gearbox fluids before delivery. Service, if required, as specified in the "Service, lubrication information."
Check that tractor hydraulic reservoir has been serviced and that hydraulic system and all functions have been operated through full cylin- der stroke to purge air from system.
After pressurizing and operating all Seedbetter functions, stop tractor and make sure there are no leaks in the hydraulic system. Follow all safety rules when checking for leaks.

DELIVERY CHECK LIST

(DEALER'S RESPONSIBILITY)

Show customer how to make adjustments.
Instruct customer how to lubricate and explain importance of lubrication.
Point out the safety decals. Explain their meaning and the need to keep them in place and in good condition. Emphasize the increased safety hazards when instructions are not followed.
Present Operator's Manual and request that customer and all operators read it before operating equipment. Point out the manual safety rules, explain their meanings and emphasize the increased safety hazards that exist when safety rules are not followed.
Extended & Retracted Length.
Show customer the safe, proper procedures to be used when mounting, dismounting, and storing equipment.
Explain to customer that when equipment is transported on a road or highway, safety devices should be used to give adequate warning to operators of other vehicles.
Explain to customer that when equipment is transported on a road or highway, a Slow Moving Vehicle (SMV) sign should be used to provide adequate warning to operators of other vehicles.
Explain to customer that when towing on a public road to comply with all state and local lighting/ marking laws and to use a safety tow chain.
Make customer aware of optional equipment available so that customer can make proper choices as required.

In addition to the design and configuration of equipment, hazard control and accident prevention are dependent upon the awareness, concern, judgement, and proper training of personnel involved in the operation, transport, maintenance and storage of equipment.

It has been said "The best safety device is an informed, careful operator." We ask you to be that kind of operator.

OPERATION

It has been said "The best safety device is an informed, careful operator." We ask you to be that kind of operator.

- Be familiar with the Seedbetter before starting.
- The owner is responsible for training operators in the safe operation of the Seedbetter.



WARNING



PRINCIPAL COMPONENTS

The Alloway Seedbetter consists of rear folding harrow frames, individual tine assemblies, and rolling baskets. The Seedbetter combines thr right tine with the perfect crumbler basket to do a complete job every time you work your field. The finishing harrows are for medium to shallow penetration. A uniquely styled spring tine with vibrating action to clear in trashy conditions. The

steep breasted tines have a superior mixing action and do not creat lumps. The pressurized crumbler sections level, mix, crumble, form a seed horizon and keep wind erosion down.

The Seedbetter is designed to be used as a pull-type mounted machine.

PRE-OPERATION CHECK LIST

(OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITY)

IMPORTANT

- This Pre-Operation Check List is provided for the operator. It is important to follow for both personal safety and maintenance of the Seedbetter.
- ___ Check all lubrication points and grease as instructed in Lubrication Schedule.
- ___ Use only a tractor of adequate power and weight to pull the unit.
- Check that the unit is properly attached to the tractor. On pull-type unit, be sure there is a mechanical retainer through the drawbar pin and and the safety chain is installed.
- ____ Check tire pressure. Bring to specified level.
- ____ Inspect all hydraulic lines, hoses, couplers, and fittings. Tighten, repair, or replace any leaking or damaged components.

Choosing the Correct Equipment

To ensure safe and reliable operation of the Seedbetter, use a tractor with the correct specifications. Use the following guidelines to select the correct tractor.

1. Horsepower

Use Table 1 for selecting the tractor horsepower class appropriate for your unit's width.

Increase the horsepower level by 25 percent when operating in hilly, soft, or wet conditions.

2. Tractor Weight

By following recommendations for tractor horsepower, the tractor will have sufficient weight to provide stability for unit during field operation or when transporting.

It is recommended that each tractor be equipped with a full complement of suitcase weights on the tractor front (see Figure 2 for example). This will provide the required front weight for turning and extra traction if equipped with front wheel assist.

Attaching the Seedbetter to the Tractor

■ Do not allow anyone to stand between tractor and unit when backing up to the unit.



WARNING

- Keep bystanders away from equipment
- 1. Place unit on a level, dry area free of debris and other foreign object.
- 2. Use clevis style hitch on the tractor. Lock the tractor drawbar in the center position.



CAUTION

- Do not allow anyone to stand between tractor and unit when backing up to the unit.
- 3. Provide enough clearance to back the tractor safely into the unit.
- 4. Use the implement jacks, found on the front hitch and back of center section of the toolbar, to level hitch height to tractor drawbar.
- 5. Back slowly and align the drawbar with the hitch.
- 6. Shut off the tractor, place all controls in neutral, set the parking brake, remove the key, and wait for all moving parts to stop.
- 7. Use ratchet on back of toolbar to set hitch height.

- 8. Use the hardened drawbar pin with provisions for a mechanical retainer, install a retainer, such as a klick pin.
- 9. Attach the safety chain around the drawbar or cage to prevent unexpected seperation. Provide sufficient slack for turning.
- 10. Replace ratchet on back of toolbar into transport positions.




Figure 4. Jack in field / transport position (UP)

Connecting the Hydraulics

- 1. Use a clean cloth or paper towel to clearn the couplers on the end of the hoses and the area around the couplers on the tractor.
- 2. Insert the male ends into the couplers on the tractor. Be sure they are locked in place.

CAUTION

■ Stay Clear of Seedbetter when wings are being raised or lowered. Hydraulic or Mechanical failure can result in a rapid, uncontrolled falling of wings, hitch jump or spring back. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death.

Step: 1

Check valve on unit to insure it is in Transport Position.

Step: 2

Turn wing wheels approximately 45° angle from Transport Position. Start backing machine up, this will start folding the wings forward. While backing up turn the wheels to the full 90° position. This will help push wing completely forward.




Figure 7. Wheels turned 45° for unfolding

Unfolding Machine into Field Position

Step: 3

When toolbar is straight, start folding the unit to the ground. When it is approximately at a 20° angle from the ground. Back the tractor up slightly, making sure the wing locks are snapped over the pin lock securely.

NOTE:

Center Section Drop Speed can be adjusted with needle valve to control rate of drop to reduced chance of machine damage.



Continue to lower machine to the ground.



Turn off tractor. Change valve position to field ready. This wil allow to raise or lower wing wheels.




Figure 8. Toolbar Straight w/ Wheels in Field Position

■ Stay Clear of Seedbetter when wings are being raised or lowered. Hydraulic or Mechanical failure can result in a rapid, uncontrolled falling of wings, hitch jump or spring back. Failure to follow these instructions may result in serious injury or death.

Step: 1

Stop the tractor before attempting to fold unit into Transport Position.

Step: 2

Move selector valve to Transport Position.

Raise the unit 90° from the ground, while doing so this will release wing latches.




Figure 12. Toolbar Straight w/ Wheels in Field Position

Turn wheels approximately 45° from Field Position. Start moving forward, this will start unfolding the wings backard. While moving forward turn the wheels to the full 90° position. This will help push wings completely backward.




Figure 13. Toolbar Straight w/ Wheels turned 45°

Make sure all compenents look transport ready. Check all lights and slow moving vehicle sign.




Figure 14. Toolbar folded back w/ wheels in Transport Position

FIELD OPERATION

The Alloway Seedbetter is designed with the flexibility to operate well in almost any kind of crop and terrain condition. However, the operator is responsible for being familiar with all operating and safety procedures and following them.

Each operator should review this Field Operation section at the start of the season and as often as required to be familiar with the unit.

Operators should also review the PRE-OPERATION CHECK LIST. Attaching the Seedbetter to the tractor and transporting the unit.



WARNING

- Safety instructions are important! Read all attachment and power unit manuals; follow all safety rules and safety decal information. (Replacement manuals are available from your Alloway dealer.) Failure to follow instructions or safety rules can result in serious injury or death.
- Never allow children or untrained persons to operate equipment.
- Keep hands, feet, hair, and clothing away from equipment while engine is running. Stay clear of all moving parts.
- Before dismounting the power unit or performing any service or maintenance, follow these steps: disengage power to equipment, lower all raised components to the ground, operate valve levers to release any hydraulic pressure, set parking brake, stop engine, remove key, and unfasten seat belt.
- Never allow riders on power unit or attachment.
- Do not allow bystanders in the area when operating, attaching, removing, assembling, or servicing equipment.
- Operators must be instructed in and be capable of the safe operation of the equipment, its attachments, and all controls. Do not allow anyone to operate this equipment without proper instructions.



CAUTION

- Always sit in power unit seat when operating controls or starting engin. Securely fasten seat belt, place transmission in neutral, engage brake, and ensure all other controls are disengaged before starting power unit engine.
- Keep bystanders away from equipment.

Transporting the Unit

- 1. Be sure all bystanders are clear of the unit.
- 2. Be sure the unit is securely attached to the tractor and all retainer pins are installed.
- 3. Be sure safety chain is installed.
- 4. Clearn the SMV emblem, lights, and reflectors and be sure they are working.
- 5. Be sure you are in compliance with all applicable lighting and marking regulations when transporting. Check with your local authorities.

- 6. Never transport the unit faster then 20 mph (32 km/h). The ratio of the tractor weight to the seedbetter weight plays an important role in defining acceptable travel speed. Table 2 summarizes the recommended travel to speed-to-weight ratio.
- 7. Be sure all jack stands are in transport position.
- 8. If wing weels want to ride out too far, use hydraulics to turn and run them in narrower.

Ground Speed

Travel speed can vary between 6 and 10 mph depending on the soil and the terrain conditions. The operator is responsible for noting the condition of the work, setting speed to obtain a quality tilling job, and maintaining control of the unit.

Field Operation Continued Storage

A

WARNING

- Block equipment securely for storage.
- Keep children and bystanders away from storage area.

At the end of the season, the Seedbetter should be thoroughly inspected and prepared for storage. Repair or replace any worn or damage components to prevent unnecessary down time at the beginning of the next season.

To ensure a long, trouble-free life, prepare the unit for storage by carrying out the following procedure:

- 1. Clear the area of bystanders, especially children.
- 2. Thoroughly wash the unit, using a pressure washer to remove all dirt, mud, debris, and residue.
- 3. Inspect for damage or entangled material. Remove entangled material. Repair or replace damaged parts.
- 4. Inspect all hydraulic hoses, lines, couplers, and fittings. Tighten all loose fittings. Replace any hose that is cut, nicked, abraded, or separating from the crimped end of a fitting.

- 5. Lubricate all grease fittings. Make sure all grease cavities have been filled with grease to remove any water residue from from pressure washing.
- 6. Touch up all paint nicks and scratches to prevent rust.
- 7. Move to storage area. Select a dry area free of debris. Store in an area away from human activity.
- 8. Unhook from tractor.

NOTE: Do not deflate tires.

- 9. If the unit cannot be placed indoors, cover with a waterproof tarpaulin and tie securely. Store away from human activity
- 10. Do not allow children to play on or around the stored unit.

SERVICE & MAINTENANCE



WARNING

- Before dismounting power unit or performing any service or maintenance, follow these steps:
 - Disengage power to equipment.
 - Lower all raised components to the ground.
 - Operate valve levers to release any hydraulic pressure.
 - Set parking brake.
 - Stop engine.
 - Remove key.
 - Unfasten seat belt.
- Before working underneath, read manual instructions, securely block up, and check stability. Secure blocking prevents equipment from droping due to hydraulic leak down, hydraulic system failure, or mechanical component failure.
- Keep all persons away from operator control area while preforming adjustments, service or maintenance.



CAUTION

- Always wear relatively tight and belted clothing to avoid entanglement in moving parts. Wear sturdy, rough-soled work shoes and protective equipment for eyes, hair, hands, hearing, and head; and respirator or filter mask where appropriate.
- Make certian all movement of equipment components has stopped before approaching for service.

LUBRICANTS

Use the Lubrication Service Record (Page 36), to keep a record of all schedualed maintenance.

1. Grease

Use and SAE multi-purpose hight temperature grease with extreme pressure (EP) performance. A SAE multi-purpose lithium-based grease is aslo acceptable.

2. Storing Lubricants

Your unit can operate at top efficiency only if clean lubriacants are used. Use clean containers to handle all lubricants. Store them in an area protected from dust, moisture, and other contaminants.

GREASING

Use the Lubrication Service Record (Page 36), to keep a record of all schedualed maintenance.

- 1. Use a hand-held grease gun for all greasing.
- 2. Wipe grease fitting with a clean cloth before greasing to avoid injecting dirt and grit.
- 3. Replace and repair broken fittings immediately.
- 4. If fittings will not take grease, remove and clean thoroughly. Also clean lubricant passageway. Replace fitting if necessary.




Figure 30. Lubrication Points
